TITLE I: PRINCIPLES: ABOUT THE ENERGY COMMUNITY

WHO IS WHO?

***The executive body** or "Executive Board", will consist of 5 members (one for each portfolio plus a President) chosen from among persons with high energy competences.

With a particular and equitable rotation, every 5 years the Board will be renewed through a vote that will involve the Energy Ministerial Council ** with the assent of the European Parliament ****.

** **The Energy Ministerial Council** will be composed of the national ministers involved in energy (for Italy would participate the Minister of Economic Development) and its work will be supported by the European Regulators Council.

*** **The European Regulators Council** will be formed by 27 national regulators and it will result as the institutionalization of today's CEER (Council of European Energy Regulators) and ERGEG (European Regulators' Group for Electricity and Gas). At each meeting of the ERC there will be two representatives from the European Commission in order to secure the cooperation between the two Institutions.

**** **The European Parliament** will form inside a special legislative Assembly for Energy with a specific composition that will reflect the structure of the EP.

The novelty of this institutional apparatus must be the non-interference (or max the slightest ..) of the policy level on matters that are technical by nature.

All addresses coming from the **EMC, will be implemented in the form of legislative proposals via Executive Board. These proposals will then be examined by the European Regulators Council and then the Energy ministerial Council and the EU Parliament should take a decision.
